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| <p><u>Yukon Chamber of Mines with Brianne Warner</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Chamber of Mines mentioned the amount of exploration money put back in Yukon. • Access to land is the biggest factor with Mineral Regulations. • 220 Million Spent in Yukon in 2019-2020 in exploration. • Stakeholders in the Mining industry would like to be able provide feedback to the land use planning process to discuss the impacts • In order to proceed with green processes, the mining industry has to be able to provide the material needed. • The future of mining is low impact, and would be respectable to all Parties. • Without mining the Yukon (Canada) will be looking to other countries to supply the goods needed to process and build. This would take Yukon out of the mining industry. • The Commission would like to know what the commission can take from the presentation into their next two day of meeting • The Chamber of Mines is cautiously optimistic, they want sustainable mining projects and to work with First Nations. • The Chamber of Mines have been trying to show an improved and futuristic mining approach and feels they are suffering from 30 years of Yukon not reinforcing their own regulations • Chamber of Mines would like to see a clear and transparent Land Use Planning approach. | |
